FROM MARILYN WITT, SR. WARDEN

The hymns of Advent are the deepest cry of our hearts.

Of all the liturgical seasons in the Christian year, the four Sundays in Advent are the most musical. I used to not pay much attention to the hymns during Advent. I was just looking forward to the beautiful Christmas carols that I love.

Then I began reading the words and discovered these are hymns of yearning and wonder. Some are ancient verses reflecting prophecy and biblical imagery expressing a longing for the Messiah. Others are poetic and theologically profound. All reflect the emotion of the 18th-century French hymn:

O come, divine Messiah! The world in silence waits the day When hope shall sing its triumph, And sadness flee away.

Dear Savior, haste Come, come to earth Dispel the night and show your face And bid us hail the dawn of grace

Then there is "Prepare Ye the Way of the Lord". This morning we were so wonderfully surprised and delighted to hear this hymn beautifully sung by Rosie and played by Sam. Isn't it fitting that even before Jesus began his ministry, people were preparing for his coming. John the Baptist preached about the arrival of the kingdom, and baptized those who were willing. Read Scripture: Matthew 3: 1–12.

I am reminded of the musical Godspell, which opens with John the Baptist singing the lyrics, "Prepare ye the way of the Lord." Soon, he is joined by the rest of the cast, who sing in joyous unison about the coming of the Christ. I think that if we all pursued Jesus with the same energy and love as the disciples in Godspell, the world would be a better place.

Prepare ye the way of the Lord. Prepare ye the way of the Lord. Make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Fill every valley Bring all mountains low. Go up to a mountain and shout with a loud voice. Say to all people, Here is your God.

How about, "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot." Ah! Now that will be running through your head the rest of the day. This is a classic, well known and well loved, African-American spiritual. There are some that say this was written by "Wallis Willis, a Choctaw freedman in Oklahoma, who was inspired to write the song when viewing the Red River." Others believe it was an old song sung by slaves. Couldn't it be both?
