We had a lovely visit with the Bishop in December on Zoom. She asked us to dream about our future. What would we like to be and do? Who are we as a body of Christ?


Vivian Simpson's funeral was held at the church. It was a beautiful service, celebrating a life well lived. The church provided a catered dinner for the Clarks.
