UPDATE: OUR WORK OF THE LAST 3 YRS

We've done different self studies and projects the last 2 or 3 years. We did New Beginnings to decide that we wanted to continue our mission as a church to feed people, spiritually and physically. This work produced a future story for 5 years from now stating that we were able to continue worshiping together by opening our building to others in the community to provide income and to reach people beyond our doors. We decided selling land would help us financially to support our church.

The Church Buildings for Collaborative Partnership committee did work to determine how to share our resources and to build partnerships in the community.

As a result of this work, we developed an emergency food pantry and increased our food basket ministry to 3 times a year.

We have invited people in to use our space for birthday parties and baby showers and planning meetings and have received donations.

We continue to support AA twice a week and have recently added a weight loss support group called SWAT that meets weekly. They all contribute financially. The College for congregational development gave us a \$2000 grant to use to improve our ways of invitation.

We have a partnership with the SAWS ministry and several of our members have been active in building 12 ramps in Henry County last summer. They will continue to grow and build.

The New Castle School Corporation has bought the back half of our property. We are building partnerships with their agricultural program to start a community garden as a part of their education thru the AG club. Their building trades department is building us a new barn.

We have applied for 2 grants to help pay for all the extra expenses of the new barn, SAWS, and the garden. We are also purchasing a new church sign to make the church more visable to the increase in visitors to the church as the building is better utilized by the community.
