
SAFE CHURCH

Dr. Matt Shoemaker, superintendent of New Castle Schools brought 2 teachers to church on January 29 to tell us about their plans for their new property. It is very exciting and progressive education. They have an agriculture program and environmental education and clubs that will be expanding to include a greenhouse using Aquaculture. There will be fish tanks to farm fish and they use the water with their waste to water and fertilize the plants. Everything grown there can be used in the school to feed students. They will be providing students to take care of a community garden that Sam Hua has volunteered to get started. Talk to him about helping with that. The building trades program will be building our new barn. It's a cutting-edge program for a high school and we are excited to have been a part of it through the land sale.
